



School Advisory Council (SAC) Semi-Annual Report Reference Guide

As part of the Renaissance Charter School initiative, School Advisory Councils (SAC) are established at each school to assist in the selection and ongoing monitoring of qualified turnaround teams that meet the needs and interests of the school community. The Renaissance SACs serve in an advisory capacity, providing input and feedback to the Charter School and the School District.

Each Renaissance Charter School SAC will have the following three main functions:

- Monitor performance and fidelity of the Charter School: The SAC shall monitor the Charter School in the Charter School's ongoing review of the implementation of its goals as outlined in its Charter.
- Solicit feedback from broader school community: The SAC shall solicit feedback from the broader School community to inform the SAC's ongoing review of the Charter School's implementation of the Charter.
- Report to the School District: Twice a year throughout the term of the Charter, the SAC shall report to the School District on the fidelity of the Charter School's implementation of the Charter and the performance of the school.

The Semi-Annual Report serves as a review tool for the SAC, Charter School, and School District on the following:

- Fidelity of the Charter School's implementation of its charter
- Adherence to roles and responsibilities of the SAC and the Charter School based on the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
- Highlights, challenges, and next steps

The Semi-Annual reports will cover two periods:

- First Semester (September to December)
- Second Semester (January to June)

Report Content

The following are topics a SAC may want to cover in one or both of its semi-annual reports. Please aim to discuss at least 7 out of 10 of the topics below, and please feel free to add other categories. The best reports are those that reflect input from the entire SAC and are based on your observations, discussions, and school data. There is no minimum or maximum report length.

1. SAC Development and Growth
2. Relationship between SAC and the Charter School
3. School Design (curriculum and program implementation)
4. Student Assessment and Achievement
5. Staffing (school leadership, teachers, and professional development)
6. School Culture, Climate, and Safety
7. Admissions and Enrollment
8. Outreach and Communications with School Community
9. Facilities
10. Catch-all category

How is the SAC working to improve its structure and governance (including increasing SAC membership, attendance, and participation, and fulfilling roles and responsibilities)?

How effective is the Charter School in supporting behavioral health and/or emotional issues (i.e. social services, wraparound services, etc.)?
